

Team Work Week Duties

It is expected that each team do the following during their assigned work weeks:

- *Clean the arena at least 2 times throughout the week. If there is a High School game, the rink must be cleaned the evening prior to the game(or the day of the game).
 - a. Empty all garbage
 - b. Sweep Concessions, Locker Rooms, Bleachers, Bathrooms, and Benches
 - c. Clean sinks and toilets and restock bathrooms (in concession area and locker rooms)
- *Staff all volunteer positions for High School games.
(3 concession workers, 2 ticket takers, 1 security)
- *Staff all volunteer positions for evening Open Skate/Open Hockey times.
(Concession worker, rink monitor)
- *Staff all volunteer positions during assigned tournament weekends.
- *For all youth games, it is the responsibility of the team playing to staff the volunteer slots.

Volunteer Sheets will be posted approximately two weeks before events are scheduled. These sheets are posted on the bulletin board at the north end of the concession area. If you need a list of volunteers to fill empty slots, please contact the rink manager. Please do not do this at the last minute.

During home tournament weeks (which includes Badger State Games), all parents are expected to volunteer with setting up and staffing the tournament. Even if you've completed the required number of hours for the year, everyone needs to pitch in for tournament weekends.

Failure to clean the rink or failure to staff events will result in loss of practice time for the work week team.

Resurfacers Scheduling

It is the responsibility of each team to resurface before their practice slot and for all home games. All resurface drivers must be properly trained and approved to drive the UKKO. Please contact the rink manager for training sessions or a list of approved drivers. It is recommended that each team have one person in charge of scheduling their resurface times, this will ensure that someone will always be there to clean the ice. **If it is your work week, your team is responsible for resurfacing before Open Skate/Open Hockey times.**

The Rhinelander Ice Association is a volunteer organization. Success within our arena and programs is directly correlated to the dedication of our volunteers. The volunteer hour program also allows the RIA to keep the registration rates as low as possible.

Failing to fulfill your required hours by October 1 will result in a fee of \$10 per non-worked hour which must be paid before your child can participate the following season.
